City Travelers

In this booklet, you will find an overview of what we will be covering this term and ways you are able to support your children with this work at home.

Please use the ideas below for home learning inspiration, however you are not limited to these ideas, please feel free to demonstrate in other ways.

The topics we will be covering this term include number and place value, addition and subtraction, money and multiplication and division.

Initially, we will recap on counting forwards and backwards within 50 in ones and tens before moving onto numbers to 100. We will partition numbers into tens and ones before introducing various methods to add and subract one and 2-digit numbers.

Quick recall of number facts is also important. Please help your child to learn their number bonds to 10 and 20 by heart in any order.

Number bonds to 10	Number bonds to 20
O + 10 = 10	0 + 20 = 20
1 + 9 = 10	1 + 19 = 20
2 + 8 = 10	2 + 18 = 20
3 + 7 = 10	3 + 17 = 20

Your child needs to use these number bonds to know corresponding subtraction facts e.g if 2 + 8 = 10 then 10 - 2 = 8

Times tables

Please practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's in order to prepare the children for learning their times tables.



reading

We aim to instil a lifelong love of reading through sharing books and providing opportunities for your child to share quality books and stories.

We will continue teaching reading and writing through the Read, Write inc. phonics scheme. Your child will read every day in small groups as they continue to learn all the sounds in the scheme to enable them to become fluent readers.

Your child will bring home a reading scheme book and a library book. These will be changed at least once a week. We are encouraging the children to reread their books to help improve fluency, expression and comprehension.

We would also encourage the children to read and share a range of books, magazines and information books from home or a library.

spelling

Spelling this term will be taught through the Read, Write inc. phonics scheme.

We will also focus on the Common Exception words for Year 1 before moving on to the Year 2 words. These common words often do not follow the rules taught in phonics and have to be learnt by rote.

We will send spellings home for the children to learn on a weekly basis.



We will use traditional tales and writing about personal experiences as the basis of our English lessons. Our focus will be on embedding basic punctuation such as full stops, capital letters and question marks. We will use expanded noun phrases and adjectives to make our writing more descriptive and exciting to the reader. The children will have daily handwriting practise and the neat presentation of work will be encouraged and developed.

SCIENCE

This term we will be looking at 'Animal including Humans'. We will look at life cycles of different types of animals such as insects, amphibians and mammals and the differences in how they reproduce i.e. with live young or eggs.

We will find out what animals need to survive as well as finding out what humans need in order to stay healthy.

Why not:

- Make your own labelled life cycle poster for your favourite creature
- Investigate animals found in extreme climates such as the Arctic or Rain Forest and produce a fact file.

HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

In the first half term our topic will be 'Katie in London' where we will explore Deeping,
Peterborough and London. We will discover famous landmarks as well as developing fieldwork skills such as using simple compass directions and studying aerial photographs. In the second half term our history topic will be 'The Great Fire of London and the Gunpowder plot. We will ask questions to find out the main events and why they happenend.

- Find out about some of London's famous landmarks.
- Make a model/poster of a famous London landmark.

ART/DT

We will look at some of the famous paintings found in the National Portrait Gallery and produce some of our own versions of paintings such as Van Gogh's Sunflowers.

 Find out about a famous artist such as Van Gogh or an Impressionist painter and produce your own version of one of their paintings

Music

This term we will be focusing on composing, describing music and performing. We will use voices and instruments to investigate the pitch, beat and tempo of songs and music.

We will focus on Islam looking at what the Qur'an says about how a Muslim should treat others and live their lives and how they celebrate birth.
