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## Year 6 River Walk

On Tuesday afternoon, to carry out some Geography Field Work, linked to this term's Topic of Exploring Rivers the children in Year 6, visited the River Welland in Deeping St James, The children were challenged to answer questions (using accurate geographical language), they had researched in class. The children were required to investigate the course of the river; describe features of the river; explore uses of the river and to consider issues such as river pollution, its causes and impact. The children really enjoyed getting out into our local area and exploring the beauty of the river, as well as looking for the many forms of wildlife it supports. After such a busy afternoon of learning, it only seemed right to end the walk with a few chips from the local chip shop, enjoyed by the riverside. Geography learning is definitely hungry work!



## EYFS Forest Explorers

EYFS have been learning about caterpillars and butterflies. They hunted for red and green wool caterpillars and discovered that the red ones were much easier to find. They talked about how caterpillars are often green so predators can't find them easily and often brightly coloured caterpillars are poisonous. They matched up caterpillars with the butterflies they become as well as using flowers and leaves to print butterflies. They punched holes in leaves to create caterpillar pictures.

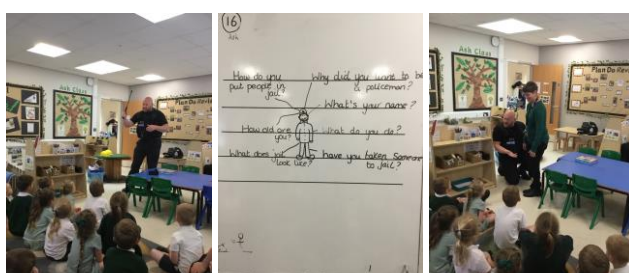
