Parent/Carer Survey Results

Thank you to all of the Parents/Carers who took the time to complete the survey that we recently sent out. We received 69 responses and have now collated the results which are as follows:

The statements at the end of the survey had these main points (it is impossible to put every comment so we have collated the trends):

- Love the school.
- Staff are very helpful and supportive.
- School offers great family support.
- Children in EYFS have settled in well.
- It is such a welcoming school.
- · School is safe.
- My children are extremely happy and thriving.
- Teachers are always smiling and build great relationships with the children.
- Staff are kind, approachable and really know the children.
- Communication could be improved.
- It would be good to have more information about what children are learning throughout the year.
- The MCAS app is not as user friendly as the old system.

We are delighted with the results from the survey as overall it is overwhelmingly positive. We will now focus on those areas that were not as strong and continually work towards improvements. Times Tables

Mr Reeve and the Year 3/Year 4 team, would like to thank the parents/carers who recently attended the TimesTables Information evening. The teachers shared information about the importance of children being fluent in their recall of multiplication knowledge by the end of Year 4, and how we as a school are working to support this fundamental learning. During the presentation, a number of different strategies for supporting children at home with this very important skill were shared and discussed, along with details of the Multiplication Timestables Check (MTC), the National Check which all the children will sit at the end of Year 4. We would also like to bring to your attention, some guidance shared relating to the teaching of times tables and how this can be approached. This guidance is for parents of children from Y2 upwards:

The example is for the 6 times tables but the principle can be applied to any.

Teaching 6 Times Table step by step

- 1. Fire just 1×6 , 2×6 , 5×6 , 10×6 at them first. This will build up on their most secure existing table facts.
- 2. Add in 3×6 , 4×6 when step 1 is frequently recalled correctly and instantly.
- 3. Build up with 6×6 , 7×6 , 8×6
- 4. When looking at 9×6 , 11×6 and 12×6 , children should: Look at finding 10×6 and adjust.

Please do not hesitate to approach your class teacher or Mr Reeve if you have any questions at all relating to supporting your children develop times tables fluency or require support to access resources.
