
# World Book Day

To help celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of World Book Day staff and children came to school dressed up as their favourite book characters and everyone looked absolutely amazing. Mrs Pilsworth organised a book exchange which involved the children bringing in a book that they have read and were happy to part with, into school, wrapped up so that it could be exchanged with someone else and everyone could take home a different book. The children really enjoyed exchanging their books and were excited to take a new book home. During the day the school engaged in a variety of activities including sharing books in class, a visit from an author, writing book reviews and making book marks. The school also enjoyed a whole school assembly where they showed off their costumes and Mrs Pilsworth read the story 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers.

Thank you to parents and carers for supporting this event by sending in books for our book exchange and providing your children with such amazing costumes.

# History Off the Page - Roman Workshop

This week, Year 4 were transported back to Roman Britain with History Off the Page! The children were introduced to Marcus, the Roman leader of the fort, who explained the Roman Occupation of Britain through lots of practical activities and role play. We then spent the morning in character exploring the different work stations set up within the hall. The children made wax melted tablets and scribes to send secret Roman messages, became potters and handcrafted their own masterpiece, made their own olive oil and became mosaic makers! In the afternoon, the children became soldiers, slaves, dancers and actors and were then lucky enough to enjoy a Roman feast, where the slaves handed out cheese, wine (squash!), bread and fruit! We also enjoyed some fantastic entertainment with Roman dancing, a re-enactment of 'The boy who cried wolf' and a display of the different defensive and attacking army positions such as 'the turtle', 'the marching line' and 'the wedge'. The children behaved brilliantly and were engaged in their learning throughout the workshop. Many thanks to all parents who volunteered to come in and help with the Roman Workshop.



#### **Year 3 Maths**

On Monday Year 3 took to the field for some outdoor exploring and learning! For maths this week the children are focusing upon measurements using a ruler. The children were challenged to find the smallest stick and the biggest stick under a metre that they could. The children then measured more than one stick together to get a total. Fantastic range of measurements skills displayed from all children.





## **Year 1 Visit from Peterborough Museum**

Year 1 enjoyed their visit from Peterborough Museum. The children were able to view and handle a large selection of toys dating back from Victorian times to the 1970s. We talked about the materials they were made from, how they worked and how they compare with toys within living memory. The children then explored further with real and replica toys through enguiry-based play.



#### Start of the School Day

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we continue to adapt to the (thankfully) improving situation relating to Covid and the impact it has had on us as a school, I would like to implement a change to the existing procedures relating to the children's arrival at school. This has been a challenging time and we thank you for the support you have shown, agreeing to bring your children to school at different start times dependent on their Key Stage. Moving forward we would like to simplify this process for the children and for you as parents, by returning to a single arrival time for KS1 and KS2 children. Therefore, from the start of Term 5, we will open the school gates at 08.40am for all children in KS1 and KS2 (EYFS and Pre-school will remain as now which is 08.50), allowing them to be in class and ready to start their learning by 08.50. It is imperative that the children arrive in school in a timely manner as learning begins promptly at 08.50, with teachers and support staff supporting the children in a variety of ways, including: hearing the children read; focussed support groups; preteaching intervention groups etc. With this in mind, we would respectfully ask that you arrive at the school gates by no later than 08.50. The gates will be manned as usual by a member of the school staff to pass on any issues or concerns you may have to the class teacher. The gates will then be locked at 08.55.

We hope this return to a greater sense of normality is helpful to all and we thank you again for the continued support you give to the school and to your children's learning.


