# Year 6 SAT's Week Monday 13<sup>th</sup> - Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May 2024

We would like to remind parents that Year 6 SAT's week is Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May to Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May, and that holiday from school in this time will not be authorised. Should your child fall ill during SAT's week, we urge you to telephone the school office as soon as possible to seek further guidance.

We would advise plenty of early nights and a little gentle exercise at all times but particularly during this time. We will be opening school up from 8.15am for Year 6 during SAT"s week and inviting them to join us for a free breakfast - more details to follow. Coming into school earlier gives the children the opportunity to have a relaxed breakfast and a chat with their friends prior to sitting the SAT's and it means that they are in school in good time and not rushing around.



The children have a wide variety of skills and talents across the curriculum and they are celebrated in a variety of ways but the SAT's are a great opportunity to showcase everything that they have learnt in English and Maths at Primary School. Also, having an assessment week is good experience prior to moving on to secondary school.

#### **Nut Free School**
