Parking Outside School

If you have to drive to school, then please ensure that you park responsibly. Under no circumstances should anyone be parking on the path or the yellow zig-zag lines outside school as this makes getting into school very dangerous for our children and families. Unfortunately, schools do not have parking areas on site for parents so it is important that you allow enough time at drop off and collection times to park responsibly and get to school for your child's allocated time. Thank you for helping us to keep everyone safe.



End of the School Day Arrangements

Drop off and collection times are always the busiest times of the day at a school. Linchfield is a large primary school and therefore to ensure these times are safe and run as smoothly as possible, we all need to work together.

End of the School Day

- Foundation Stage and Year 1 Enter through the Foundation Stage gate near the front office, collect your child from his/her classroom door and then exit out of the Foundation Stage gate and go around to collect other children if you need to. Please don't walk through the school grounds to get to the playground to collect older children as this poses a safeguarding issue.
- Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 Enter through either of the gates and collect your child from his/her classroom door and exit out of either of the gates.
- Year 5 and Year 6 Enter through either of the gates and collect your child from their line outside Treehouse and then exit out of either of the gates.

Please be patient at the end of the school day as teachers are getting to know both all of the children in their class and their parents/carers. Our priority is always the children's safety and we want to ensure that all children leave with the correct adults.

Democracy

It has been a very exciting first week back at Linchfield as we have been learning about democracy and its' history. The children had the wonderful opportunity to take part in the democratic process of electing their class School Parliament representatives and Linchfield's Head Boy and Head Girl. In classes, the children listened to the speeches of those running for School Parliament and then the whole school came together to listen to the speeches of the Year 6 children hoping to be Head Boy or Head Girl. Every child that prepared a speech and ran for a position should be incredibly proud of their achievements, even if unsuccessful in obtaining a position.

The Year 6 children who were brave enough to prepare a speech and deliver it in a whole school assembly, deserve special recognition for their excellent speeches. They represented themselves and our school in such a fabulous way, demonstrating our school values of resilience, respect, responsibility, resourcefulness and reflection. What is Times Table Rock Stars?

Times Tables Rock Stars is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice. Each week concentrates on a different times table, with a recommended consolidation week for rehearsing the tables that have recently been practised every few weeks. This format has very successfully boosted times tables recall speed for hundreds of thousands of pupils over the last 8 years.

Why are we promoting Times Table Rock Stars?

Times Table Rock Stars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help pupils master the times tables. To be a Times Table Rock Star you need to answer any multiplication fact up to 12×12 in less than 3 seconds! The goal is for all participating rockers to be Times Table Rock Stars after 20 weeks!

How to access Times Table Rock Stars at home?

You can log on to Times Tables Rock Stars through the website (ttrockstars.com), or through the app which is available free across all Apple and Android devices. You simply need to find the school's name by typing it in and then enter your child's username and password.
