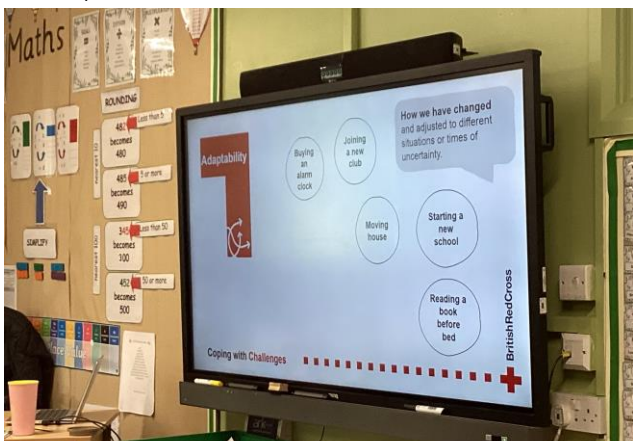
FLS Father's Day
