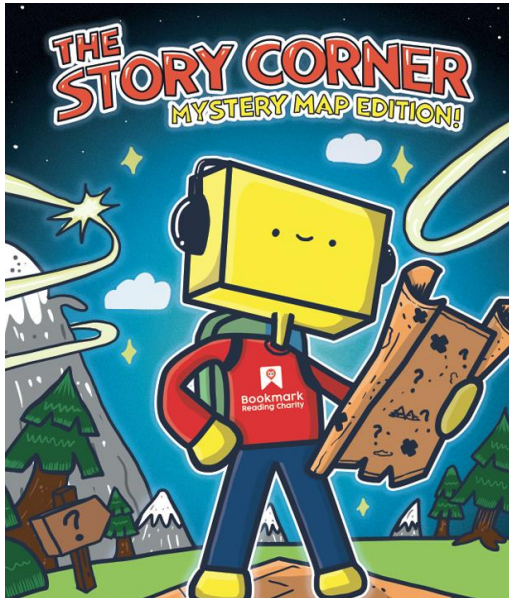

Well, it's been an explosive term in Y6! Over the past few weeks, in their Geography topic, the children have been learning all about our 'Extreme Earth.' We have shared learning on everything from Extreme Weather to Tsunamis; Earthquakes and Volcanoes. The children had great fun learning about 'plate tectonics,' using Oreo cookies to simulate the movement of the Earth's crust. Space Planetarium

On Tuesday, Year 5 enjoyed a fabulous visit from Star Lincs. We had the experience of a Space Planetarium, where we explored the planets in our solar system and the stars we can see in our night sky. We were blown away by so many incredible facts about the vast solar system that we are such a tiny part of. A particular fact that we were all really shocked by is that the International Space Station travels at up to 17,500 miles per hour, but miraculously, astronauts can walk along the outside of the ISS and they feel no effects because there is no air resistance. We all thought that they would be knocked off, like when you put your hand out of a moving car window, but this is not the case! Another fact that the children loved is that Neptune rains diamonds! In the afternoon, the children engaged in a Mission to Mars workshop where they designed and made landing crafts out of Lego, which they tested by dropping to see how well they would survive (it appears we only have one group of budding space-craft engineers)! Attendance

Attendance at school is important for students to get the most out of their school experience, including attainment, wellbeing and wider life opportunities. It is a legal responsibility of every parent/carer to ensure that their child receives that education.

Reporting an absence

If your child is absent from school, please promptly notify school by providing a reason every day of the absence. Accurate and detailed attendance records are essential and your support in reporting these absences contributes towards this.

Whilst we encourage medical appointments to be taken outside of school hours, we recognise that this is not always possible. If you must take your child to an appointment during the school day, please only do so for the essential time to minimise disruption to learning.

Requests for Leave of Absence

Parents must request permission in advance from school for leave of absence for any reason, including holidays. Headteachers cannot grant leave during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances and cannot grant permission retrospectively.

If you take your child out of school without permission this may lead to enforcement action (penalty notice or prosecution).

Penalty Notices

Under the new national framework, Fixed Penalty Notices will be considered when a child has missed ten or more sessions (five days) due to unauthorised absence in a period of ten school weeks.

School attendance is a high priority for everyone, fixed penalty notices would be used as a last resort. The Local Authority and schools are committed to improving attendance and achievement and would like parents/carers to work with us to ensure the best possible outcomes for their children.

Thank you for working together as part of our school community to ensure that your child's education remains a priority. If you have any questions, or you would like any support with the attendance of your child, feel free to contact school.
